Your Parish Committee met via Zoom last month on November 11th. Here are some highlights.

- Due to the rise in COVID cases on Island, the Fall yard clean up at the Chapel has been cancelled.
- We discussed ways for our members and friends to maintain connections this winter. If you have suggestions, please contact Celeste.
- Did you know that only 50% of members and friends are opening their Friday emails and other church communications? We encourage everyone to be sure to read all announcements for important community information.
- To make Sunday services more widely available, the Worship Committee will discuss possibly recording them. The PC will also evaluate whether there is technology we should be investing in for once we're all back together in the Chapel -

livestreaming, etc.

- Thank you to all who have sent in your 2021 Pledge cards. We are soooo close to our goal of "All In." It's not too late!
- Our financial picture remains strong.
 - We've received 92% of 2020 pledges.
 - We expect a surplus of funds at year end, which will be swept into a reserve fund/ future fund.
- The Finance Committee is developing a 2021 budget. Jan Casey will present this at the November 22nd Town Hall Meeting following Sunday service.
- We approved the Nominating/Leadership Development Committee's slate for 2021. The congregational vote will take place at the Annual Meeting on January 24, 2021.
- We discussed how best to structure the visioning

work that needs to be done by the congregation in early 2021. Including:

- Evaluating our Vision 2020 – how did we do?
- Creating a Vision 2025.
- How do our desires for a Minister and Parish Hall/back property development support our vision?
- Several PC members will be creating a roadmap/timeline. If you have interest in volunteering with this work, please let Rita know.

Healthy Aging Martha's Vineyard offers a Home Safety Modification Program. This is a pilot program to provide housing modifications to Island homeowners 65 years and older. In partnership with the Martha's Vineyard Builders Association, program leaders are hoping to complete up to 20 home modifications.

To qualify you must live on Martha's Vineyard, including Chappaquiddick, own your own home, or live in a home owned by a family member, be 65 years or older, and complete an application.


The program can do modifications that span simple to complex, such as: traction or nonskid strips installed in bathrooms, kitchens, or staircases; provide shower benches or transfer chairs; provide easyuse fixtures; install grab bars, push-button door openers, pull out shelves, stair lifts, and more! Materials List to Make a Hanukia

Option I: Nine tealights and a bowl of water in which to float them.

Option 2: a piece of wood, flat on at least one side, no less than 9 inches long and two inches wide, Play Dough, a box of Chanukah candles (Shirley's has them).

Latke Recipe

2 lbs. Russet potatoes, peeled I medium yellow onion One large egg I-2 tbs. flour

Salt and pepper

Vegetable or Canola oil Sour Cream or applesauce for serving

- 1. Alternate grating potatoes and onion on the large holes of a box grater into a colander. Drain 30 minutes.
- 2. Squeeze out as much liquid and starch as you can.
- 3. Mix together all the ingredients except the oil in a large bowl.
- 4. Heat a skillet over medium heat. When it's hot, add two tbs. of oil. When the oil is hot, drop tablespoons of mixture into pan to make three inch pancakes. Flip when browned underneath.
- 5. Remove to paper towel lined plate and continue to add oil and make latkes until all the potato mixture is used up, or just slap the latkes right onto the plate you're eating off of right out of the pan. Serve with sour cream or applesauce or both!


