He was arrested twice protesting the refusal of the S.C. legislature to extend Medicaid benefits. He writes for a local paper in his hometown of Forest City. For 19 years, he and co-writers have performed *Radio Free Bubba* on WNCW.org. He loves his family and his dog and everything. His favorite words found on the back of a car are, "Life is good." He can be found on Facebook. He's the one with the picture of him kissing his two-year-old granddaughter. He has been a pastoral minister for 32 years. He is the author of 365 Ways To Criticize The Preacher and other books. The Georgia immigration group Rev. Jobe referenced in his talk this morning is El Refugio and can be found with an easy Internet search.
